Some characteristics of psoriatic arthritis - for example symmetric arthritis involving the small joints of the hands - can occur in both conditions. So if a patient with skin psoriasis had these symptoms, the doctor would likely diagnose psoriatic arthritis, rather than psoriasis plus rheumatoid arthritis.

Psoriatic arthritis is a type of arthritis that affects some people with the skin condition psoriasis. It typically causes affected joints to become swollen, stiff and painful. Like psoriasis, psoriatic arthritis is a long-term condition that can get progressively worse. If it's severe, there's a risk of the joints becoming permanently damaged or deformed, and surgery may be needed.

<u>Psoriatic arthritis - NHS</u>

Rheumatoid arthritis is an autoimmune disease. This means your immune system (which usually fights infection) attacks the cells that line your joints by mistake, making the joints swollen, stiff and painful. Over time, this can damage the joints, cartilage and nearby bone.

A family history of rheumatoid arthritis was more common in patients with uncomplicated rheumatoid arthritis than in those with un-complicated psoriasis (P < 0.01). There was no significant difference in the frequency of such a family history between the patients with uncomplicated rheumatoid arthritis and those with psoriasis and arthritis.
