Breaking Their Will Sexual Assault and Abuse During slavery, white male plantation owners, their sons, brothers and other male acquaintances raped Black women without fear of punishment. Their reasons ranged from lascivious desire to acts of punishment. Black men were also sexually abused by slaveholders, and, sometimes, their wives.

Slave punishment goes as extreme as cutting off or rendering useless, some body parts of the slave, such as the limbs, finger (s), palm, ears, genitals, etc. That of genital torture and castration were often used as a punishment and deterrent for sexual offences.
