A clinical diagnosis is based on the medical history and physical examination of the patient: it may be confirmed with X-Rays, CAT Scans (Computerized Axial Tomography), MRI (Magnetic Resonance Imaging), and other laboratory tests. Diagnosis by physical examination includes ascertaining temperature, pulse, and blood pressure and involves the use of palpation, to detect enlarged organs and other abnormalities; tapping, to ...

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Clinically typical measles is defined as presenting with the classical symptoms of cough and coryzal symptoms, and conjunctivitis, and fever of 39°C or more without antipyretics, and maculopapular rash. The prodromal phase occurs 10-12 days after contracting the infection and lasts for 2-4 days before the rash becomes apparent. Symptoms include increasing fever, malaise, cough, rhinorrhoea, and conjunctivitis.
