These decisions should be made by those receiving care, informed by the tacit and explicit knowledge of those providing care, within the context of available resources' ...

The term evidence-based practice (EBP) has developed from the term evidence-based medicine (EBM) which was introduced into medical literature in 1991. A commonly used definition of EBM is: 'the conscientious, explicit, and judicious use of current best evidence in making decisions about the care of individual patients'.

Evidence-based practice involves the therapist making decisions about which therapy to deliver based on three guiding factors: (1) the best-available research evidence bearing on which treatments work best and why, (2) clinical judgement and experience in assessment and formulation of a client's presenting problems, and (3) client preferences and values.

Levels of Evidence. Evidence-based practice is a conscientious, problem-solving approach to clinical practice that incorporates the best evidence from well-designed studies, patient values and preferences, and a clinician's expertise in making decisions about a patient's care. Unfortunately, no standard formula exists for how much these factors should be weighed in the clinical decision-making process.
