In general though, the following Georgia divorce rules apply: After one spouse files for divorce, the other has 30 days to respond to the Complaint if he or she lives in the state of Georgia. If the other party lives in the United States, in a state other than Georgia, he or she has 60 days to respond to the Complaint.
