Improvising With the Pentatonic Scale • Play Guitar!

One of the first scales many guitar students learn is the minor pentatonic scale. It is popular because it can be used to improvise over the blues and sounds great against minor and 7 th chords.

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To improvise over major chords, a very popular scale of choice is the major pentatonic. This is a major scale with the half steps omitted.

Pentatonic scales are widely attributed with shaping rock music.

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Listen to Guns N' Roses' Sweet Child O' Mine and AC/DC's Back In Black, for instance – those iconic licks are founded upon the pentatonic scale. And the 'neutrality' of the scale means it's also been employed in other genres, such as country, blues and folk.

improvisation than the minor pentatonic scale. Sometimes using a minor pentatonic scale will just sound wrong. Minor pentatonic scales work best if a song is a) in a minor key b) in a major key with a blues feel to it. The next sound to explore is the major pentatonic scale.
