Particularly in children with cerebral palsy, assessment of hand function has become more exact and the range of possible interventions has expanded. Changes in treatment approaches can be seen in neurorehabilitation, orthopaedic management, developmental pediatrics and rehabilitation including occupational and physical therapy practices.

The Assisting Hand Assessment (AHA) is a test of hand function in children with difficulties using one of their hands. The AHA measures how effectively the affected hand and arm is used in bimanual performance. An

assessment is performed by observing the child's spontaneous handling of toys in a relaxed and playful session. AHA 18-18

Children's Hand-use Experience Questionnaire (CHEQ) CHEQ is a newly developed questionnaire. It has been developed for children and adolescents with decreased function in one hand, for example hemiplegic CP, obstetric brachial plexus palsy (OBPP) and upper limb reduction deficiency, and for their parents.

Results indicate that hand function in this clinical population develops differently from overall upper-extremity skills with declines in function in upper-extremity skills being more common and pronounced among older children. However, there is substantial interindividual variation.

More than 60% of children with bilateral CP have impaired hand function. 5 Manual ability among these children is typically classified within all levels of the Manual Ability Classification System (MACS), 6 including the more severe MACS levels IV and V, 5, 7 whereas children with unilateral CP are usually classified within MACS levels I to III.

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
