For a key of C harmonica, the 5th scale tone is G (C=1, D=2, E=3, F=4, G=5), so playing 2nd position on a C harmonica is playing in the key of G (technically the G "mixolidian" mode). 3rd position, sometimes called "slant harp" or "double-crossed", is the scale starting another 5th up from 2nd position, e.g. for a C harmonica, D. (2nd position G=1, A=2, B=3, C=4, D=5.)

Harmonica positions are basically how harmonica players can play different scales on a single harmonica. To explain: when playing a C harmonica, the tuning is designed to allow as much versatility as possible, including many different scales and chords. The lowest note (1 blow) is a C and the highest note (10 blow) is also a C.

Harmonica players began to experiment and found that when they primarily used the inhale (draw) notes, a different kind of sound was provided. This resulted in a new and more fluid style of playing, known as 2 nd Position (Cross Harp). 90% of today's players use 2 nd Position for Blues, Rock, Country & Pop music.

Positions on a harmonica are numbered 1 through 12. Each time you count up five scale steps from the key of the harp, you've reached the next position. The blow chord (C on a C-harmonica) is designed to be the harp's home chord. When players use the blow chord as home base, they call it straight harp, or first position.

1st position just means playing in the key that the harmonica comes in. So, if you have an A harmonica you will be playing in the key of A. The root note will be the 1 blow, 4 blow, 7 blow and 10 blow. 2nd position (Cross Harp)
