Theories of law and justice. For the purpose of these notes the term ' law ' refers not only to the substantive law, whether developed in the courts, by Parliament or from other sources, but also to procedural rules and principles by which the laws themselves are made and the legal system administered. Difference Between Law and Justice. The concepts of law and justice are often confused and misinterpreted by many. While the two are strictly connected, they are not the same thing. Justice is a broad concept that is based on equality of rights, fairness and morality. Conversely, law is a body of regulations and standards set up by governments and international bodies and is (or should be) based on the idea of justice.

What is the European Court of Justice? Located in Luxembourg, the ECJ oversees the correct application and implementation of EU law. It consists of judges from all member states.
