The major complications that account for nearly 75% of all maternal deaths are (4): severe bleeding (mostly bleeding after childbirth) infections (usually after childbirth) high blood pressure during pregnancy (pre-eclampsia and eclampsia) complications from delivery unsafe abortion.

Most maternal mortality occurs in the developing world; every day in 2015, 830 women died worldwide as a result of a pregnancy-related

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problem, the vast majority in sub-Saharan Africa. Maternal mortality has decreased significantly between 1990 and 2015 but not quickly enough to achieve the Millennium Development Goal of a reduction of 75% in the number of deaths per live births by 2030.

In most high-income countries, maternal mortality is now very low. The average rate in the European Union is 8 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births. In some countries such as Poland, Greece, Finland and Sweden, the rate is even lower at 3 to 4 per 100,000. In Sierra Leone a woman is 300 to 400 times more likely to die with each pregnancy.

The US has the "highest rate of maternal mortality in the industrialized world." In the United States, the maternal death rate averaged 9.1 maternal deaths per 100,000 live births during the years 1979 – 1986, but then rose rapidly to 14 per 100,000 in 2000 and 17.8 per 100,000 in 2009. The majority of maternal deaths between 2010 to 2018 involved cardiovascular issues such as arrhythmia and pericardial tamponade, the report found. Infections or sepsis were the second leading cause.
