Supporting medication administration | First Steps | RCN

Insert the syringe without the piston into the end of the nasogastric tube. Pour the medications into the syringe and allow them to flow with gravity. Follow the administration with about 30 to 50 ml of water for an adult and 15 to 30 ml for children to clear the tube and to maintain its patency.

Standards for medicines management - Nursing and Midwifery ...

Prescribed medication is the most frequent treatment provided to patients in the NHS. The five rights of safe and effective medication management are clearly defined in law as: the right medicine is given to the right patient at the right time, in the right form of the drug and at the right dose. All professionals who are involved in medicine management are governed by a legal and professional accountability to follow best practice when prescribing and administering medi-cation.

Improving practice and patient safety through a medication ...

Nurses are primarily responsible for safe medication administration. Nurses draw from their foundational knowledge of patient conditions and organisational processes and use clinical reasoning that supports safe medication practice. There was minimal evidence clearly articulating nurses' clinical reasoning used to support medication safety.
