When the captive-bred Harris's hawk is ready to be flown free, training is over and the fun begins! The next three weeks -- hunting! In the first three weeks post-training it is a great advantage if the young bird can be flown hard for an hour or two every day, seeing plenty of game.

Tips on acquiring and training captive-bred Harris' hawks
We train and hunt our Harris's Hawks always in the company of others. Hawks are introduced to one another in stages. After being caught up and jessed out, new hawks are tethered in the weathering area near one another. We also man them by going for walks, each carrying a hawk.

Harris Hawk, The: Management, Training and Hunting: Harris ---
Training is accomplished through careful weight management, positive reinforcement, and repetition. The first step in training entails a period known as "manning". It is during this time that the hawk begins to overcome its fear of people, becomes accustomed to the falconer, and learns to associate food with the falconer's glove.

Basic Training+ Ohio Falconry Association
Most captive bred Harris's Hawks do not require anywhere near as much repetition in training as a passage Red-tailed Hawk. DO NOT allow a captive bred Harris's Hawk to get low in weight. This can bring on screaming and mantling, and it is one cause of a fist-bound hawk. For some hawks,it alters the way they look at you and the world, with the focus being too inward and too much on the falconer. Let the hawk's behavior dictate how much weight reduction is needed--which often isn't much. NEVER ...
